Position Overview

The Clinical Lead, Psychology will work within the Supervisor Training Program (STP) and be responsible for performing subject coordination including marking and assessments, delivering training and workshops, participating in curriculum development and other activities as required.

The Murtupuni Centre for Rural and Remote Health is part of a national network of federally funded University Departments of Rural Health with a mission to lead excellence in remote, rural and Indigenous Health. The Clinical Lead Psychology will contribute to the development of a rural and remote mental health services and workforce through building supervision capacity in the rural and remote psychology and allied health workforce for outback Australia. The position will also contribute to national and regional policy through research and professional leadership; and to the broader health services research and education activities of MCRRH.

Principal Accountabilities

1. Perform the role of subject coordinator for the supervisor training program (STP), ensuring the quality standards of the program are maintained.

2. Perform the marking and assessment role for the STP, ensuring timely results and feedback are provided to participants of the STP, and playing a moderating role when assessment is marked by other trainers in the STP.
3. Deliver training workshops for the STP, maintaining the quality and standard set out by the STP.
4. Participate in development activities for the STP, including curriculum development and curriculum review activities.
5. Monitor STP feedback and bring collated feedback to the STP bi-monthly team meetings for discussion.
6. Participate in research activities conducted as a part of the STP research program.
7. Support the University's commitment to the principles of [reconciliation](#), which exemplify respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander heritage and the valuing of justice and equity for all Australians.
8. Demonstrate a commitment to the University values.
9. Support the principles of the TropEco program and engage in commitment to JCU sustainability goals and objectives.

Generic Accountabilities
